Cleaner with Vegetable Microspheres and FGR36271 Talco Bum Bum**

This is in response to your email of March 05, 2014, wherein you provided additional information for the above-mentioned products, concerning their acceptability for use in food processing establishments.

**MacroCream Creamy Hand Cleaner with Vegetable Microspheres**

We acknowledge the withdrawal of your application for **MacroCream Creamy Hand Cleaner with Vegetable Microspheres** from further evaluation and our file will be adjusted accordingly.

**Sedy Wipes and MacroCream Hand Cleaner**

Based on the additional information provided, we can advise that we see no reason to object to their use as hand cleaners by employees in food processing establishments provided that:

- a) There will be no contamination of food as a result of their use and storage;
- b) After use, hands are thoroughly rinsed with potable water before handling food in the plant; and
- c) The products will not leave any residual fragrance on the hands of employees handling food.


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In regards to the labels of the products, we would recommend the following statements to be added on them:

1. A cautionary statement as in a) above.
2. A potable water rinse statement as in b) above.
3. A food plants use statement such as "For food plants and other industrial use only".
